The recent winter chill in the mountains of Sweden and Norway mountains has created a beautiful Scandinavian winter landscape. The World Ski Championships host resort of Åre will also be opening on Friday, 7 December. The ski season is long in Scandinavia, running until early May.

SkiStar Hemsedal: Last season's big hit, the SkiStar Fun Ride, is being developed, with new elements and sound. The children's area is also being developed, with a new children's lift and new children's slopes.
